Content to be taught and applied in writing this year

	Formation of nouns using suffixes such as -ness, -er and by compounding (e.g. whiteboard, superman)
	 Formation of adjectives using suffixes such as -ful, -less
Word	Use of the suffixes –er, –est in adjectives
	Use of –ly in Standard English to turn adjectives into adverbs
	Correct use of homophones
	Subordination (using when, if, that, because) and co-ordination (using or, and, but)
Sentence	 Expanded noun phrases for description and specification (e.g. the blue butterfly, the man in the moon)
	How the grammatical patterns in a sentence indicate its function as a statement, question, exclamation or command
	Correct choice and consistent use of present tense and past tense throughout writing
Text	Grouping of related ideas together in sections for non-fiction texts which begins to develop an awareness of paragraphs
	 Use of the progressive form of verbs in the present and past tense to mark actions in progress (e.g. she is drumming, he was shouting)
	Use of capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks to demarcate sentences
Punctuation	Commas to separate items in a list
	Apostrophes to mark omission/contraction (e.g. don't)
	Apostrophes to mark singular possession in nouns (e.g. the dog's name)
	noun phrase, adverb, verb, conjunction,
Terminology	statement, question, exclamation, command
	tense (past, present)
	apostrophe, comma
